What can I keep and how many?

Effective as of January 1, 2023.
Regulations can change in the middle of the season, so be sure to check myodfw.com/fishing/marine-zone for the most up-to-date regulations before you go fishing.



Any vessel fishing for or possessing bottomfish, Pacific halibut, or flatfish in the ocean must have a <u>functional descending device</u> onboard, regardless of depth. You are required to use it on any rockfish released outside of 30 fathoms.

Does not include species with separate limits such as: lingcod, flatfish, tuna and other offshore pelagic species, salmon, Pacific halibut surfaces harring sardings and anchories.

Anglers may keep <u>one</u> general marine fish daily bag limit of up to <u>five (5)</u> fish on a bottomfish trip and do a separate <u>offshore</u> <u>longleader</u> trip on the same day, but may total <u>no more than 10 general marine species per day.</u>
